June 7, 2009 Press Release for the NB Federation of Music Festivals

The New Brunswick Federation of Music Festivals held their 38th Provincial Music Festival this past weekend, June 5 & 6, in Woodstock, New Brunswick. Fifty-two young musicians from around the province, who had been recommended as their local festival representatives by the adjudicators at those festivals, competed in the two-day festival. This year we were pleased to have representation from nine local festivals.

The NB Federation of Music Festivals, the umbrella organization for the eleven local festivals around the province, sponsors the NB Provincial Music Festival which is under the direction of the Executive Director, Barbara Long, President Isabel LeBlanc, and a Board of Directors made up of representatives from various local festivals. This year the Carleton County Music Festival hosted the Provincial Festival.

The adjudicators for this prestigious event are specialists in their field.

Five **choral entries** were judged by recorded CDs sent to Jamie Hillman, a vocal/choral specialist. He has recommended Chorale Voce dell'Anima, under the direction of Monette Gould, and Les Jeunes Chanteurs d'Acadie under the direction of Nadine Hebert, to advance to the National Music Festival Competition. Both choirs advanced from the Greater Moncton Music Festival de musique du Grand Moncton.

The Provincial Music Festival offers three levels of competition – Junior, Intermediate and Senior.

Each of the winners in Junior, Intermediate, Senior and Choral categories received a cash prize. J. D. Irving Limited generously sponsored the Junior and Intermediate prizes.

The adjudicators recommended all the senior winners to represent NB at the 2009 National Music Festival in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, August 13-15. Percussion is a new discipline at the Provincial Music Festival and will be added to the National Music Festival in 2010. Nhat-Viet Phi will go to the National Music Festival as the accompanist for the competitors.

The panel of adjudicators also chose a **Star of the Festival** – the outstanding performance from Senior competitors. This honour went to pianist Pierre-André Doucet. Pierre-André was presented with the historical Centennial Trophy by President, Isabel LeBlanc, and received a pewter rose bowl keeper trophy as well as a scholarship.
