Session and Class times:

- Session start times are set and will be observed.
- Break times are approximate and may not begin exactly as given. However, after a break, classes will not resume earlier than the given time.
- Competitors should be in the hall at least 15 minutes prior to the beginning of their class.

Copyrighted Music:

- The Canadian Music Publishers' Association has asked all Music Festivals to advise competitors that it is illegal to reproduce copyrighted music by any means.
- The adjudicator will refuse to adjudicate a competitor who provides a reproduction of a piece of copyrighted music without having obtained the written permission of the publisher.
- A photocopy may be used for music that is out of print if written permission of the copyright holder is provided to the adjudicator.
- Accompanists must have an original score on the piano.

Performer and Audience Etiquette:

- Be respectful of performers and fellow audience members.
- Remain silent during performances.
- Audible signals of watches, cell phones, computers, cameras and other electronic devices must be turned off.
- Photography, video: family members are welcome to video or photograph their own
 children but are asked to do so in a way that minimizes the possibility of distraction
 (i.e. turn off flash, remain in your seat, etc).
- Entering and exiting the hall is not permitted during performances or adjudications.
- Performers are reminded to dress appropriately for the occasion.

Venue Restrictions:

- Performance venues are scent-free. Please refrain from wearing perfume, aftershave and other scented products.
- Food and beverages (with the exception of bottled water) must not be taken into the

Adjudicators

Strings: Paul Pulford



Cellist Paul Pulford is a chamber musician, soloist, conductor and educator. Since his debut recital in Winnipeg in 1967 he has performed on four continents and has recorded over 30 CDs.

For over 25 years Pulford pursued a passion for the string quartet, playing with the internationally

acclaimed Penderecki String Quartet from 1990-2013, and Orford String Quartet from 1987-1989. With the Penderecki Quartet he recorded many CDs including the Bartok String Quartets; Brahms, Shostakovich and Schnittke Piano Quintets; the quartets of Penderecki and many works by Canadian composers.

From 1989 to 2017 Pulford was Professor of Cello and Director of Orchestral Studies at Wilfrid Laurier University in Waterloo, where he also served for seven years as Associate Dean of Music. Pulford remains Professor Emeritus at Laurier.

As a conductor, Pulford has worked with Symphony New Brunswick, Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony, Canadian Chamber Ensemble, Mississauga Symphony, Stratford Symphony Orchestra and as Resident Conductor of the NUMUS Ensemble.

Paul was an artist-in-residence at UNB Fredericton as a member of the New Brunswick String Quartet from 1984-1989. He lives in Long Reach, New Brunswick with his partner Anne-Marie Donovan.

Piano: Carl Philippe Gionet



Carl Philippe Gionet is a pianist and multidisciplinary artist. Whether as a soloist. collaborative pianist, or pedagogue, Carl is in high demand, mainly in Europe and Canada. He completed his doctorate in piano performance at the Université de Montréal under the direction of Paul Stewart. He has also received specialized training in collaborative piano in Austria and England and participated in numerous prestigious international summer programs. In 2013, he founded Musique sur mer en Acadie, an organization dedicated to education and diffusion of classical music in francophone minority communities, and since 2014 he has been collaborative

piano professor and vocal coach at Breno Italy International Music Academy (BIIMA) and at the Centre for Opera Studies and Appreciation (COSA-Canada). He is also a visual artist, primarily painting and video installations, working almost exclusively in black and white. He is represented by Galerie ART-ARTISTE. Inspired by the contrasts observed in nature, his work is both introspective and contemplative, allowing the work to express itself, therefore offering countless avenues of interpretation. Carl is also a writer. Nominated for the Prix Antonine-Maillet – Acadie Vie with his book Icare (Icarus), published by Éditions Prise de parole in 2021, his latest book, a translation of Mary Jane Mosquito by cree author Tomson Highway, was released in March 2024. His latest album, Tu me voyais, featuring his Douze chansons folkloriques acadiennes with soprano Christina Raphaëlle Haldane was released by Leaf Music in 2022. The score for his arrangements is published and distributed by Éditions Doberman-Yppan.

Brass, Woodwinds, Band: Karem J. Simon



Conductor, clarinetist, educator Karem J Simon served as a member of the **UPEI Music Faculty from** 1991 – 2023. He is known as a passionate and sensitive musician, able to inspire players and musicians of diverse backgrounds. As director of the UPEI Wind Symphony he recorded twenty-two compact disks. His album, Solitary Clarinet, a collection of pieces for unaccompanied clarinet, is available on all the major online music streaming platforms.

Voice: Christina Haldane



Christina Raphaëlle Haldane's career spans the UK, Europe, Asia and North America, and she is based in Canada's Atlantic provinces. She has interpreted many lead opera roles, having performed for opera houses such as The Finnish National Opera, The Royal Opera Covent Garden, Scottish Opera and Musica Viva Hong Kong. Her specialism is performing Handel's Heroines, comedic bel canto roles and contemporary opera. Christina enjoys performing and curating recital and chamber music concerts, and she is often invited to

perform with leading orchestras. Christina is a bilingual English and French speaker with Acadian heritage, and she is proud to be a citizen of Canada and Great Britain.

As a recording artist, Christina fuses Western art music aesthetics with folk, jazz, and avant-garde styles. She has released two critically acclaimed albums '... LET ME EXPLAIN' (2019), a collection of Canadian art songs and 'Tu me voyais' (2022) with Leaf Music, a francophone vocal album which celebrates music from her Acadian roots.

Christina strongly believes in mentoring the next generation of talented young singers, and has an international profile as a vocal educator, adjudicator, and clinician. She is the head of the Atlantic division of Canada's national opera training program COSA and is the president of the Canadian Atlantic Provinces National Association of Teachers of Singing (NATS) chapter. Christina is also on the voice faculty at two summer voice programs, BIIMA – Breno Italy International Music Academy and Musique sur mer en Acadie, New Brunswick. She was on the Voice Faculty at Dalhousie's Fountain School of Performing Arts from 2019, and joined the team at Mount Allison's Department of Music in July, 2022, where she continues to combine her love of performing with teaching.

Christina lives in Moncton, New Brunswick, with her partner Patrice and their two diva dog Pomeranians, Wally and Sissi.

Fiddle: Louise Vautour



Passionate about Celtic music, Louise Vautour has been immersed in traditional musique since childhood. At the age of 13, she picked up the fiddle under the teachings of her father. Louise studied traditional Irish music in Dublin, Ireland and opened a music school in her home town of Bathurst, New Brunswick. She has since toured many parts of Canada, US and Europe with Ode à l'Acadie and has played the Festival Interceltique de Lorient in France twice as a solo artist. Her album Traces. which was released in 2009, is a collection of original tunes.

Her latest project has been to join the group Les Fireflies

with whom she has played many festivals including Celtic Colours, Mariposa Folk Festival and Festival du voyageur.






